From the Chaplain Fr John Hill CSSR

Soon it will be Ephpheta Sunday, our great celebration of Deaf identity. At JPC's Ephpheta Sunday Mass, we will be thanking God for three things that are central to Deaf identity: language, history and community. But we could also add a fourth: 'communications technology'. It has really changed the lives of Deaf people. When I started at JPC in 2000, I was loaned a TTY machine, and then had to learn how to use it and remember things like "GA to SK". I also used the fax machine quite a lot if I wanted to send some information to a Deaf person. Both the TTY and fax worked well, but they were not portable

and I found that using them to communicate was a slow business.

Smart phones and developments in internet technology have changed how we communicate. Text messaging has been great for Deaf communication, and apps like FaceTime, Messenger, Snapchat and What's App and that mean that we can see the person we are calling and have a conversation with them. Today's technology has helped break down the isolation that Deaf people feel, especially if they live in small country towns or out on a farm. Over the last few years JPC has been able to provide iPads to some deaf people who are living far away from any Deaf community or other Deaf people. iPads have opened up a new world of communication for these people.

So, on the one hand technology has been a great blessing for the Deaf community, but on the other hand it also brings some problems. We know that teenagers can be bullied on social media. They might get hate messages texted to them, or receive or send inappropriate material on SMS.

In the Deaf community, the biggest problem around social media is gossip. Back in the days before our present technology, gossip was a big issue in the Deaf community. Today's social media make it much easier to find out and then spread the latest gossip.

A lot of gossip is harmless, but some is very harmful and can destroy a community. It is disappointing when a Deaf person says that they don't want anything to do with other Deaf and don't want to be involved in the community because of gossip. So, what's wrong with gossip? Everyone, Deaf or hearing, has a right to their good name. That means it is wrong to communicate things about a people that will ruin their reputations. It doesn't matter if what you say is true...it is still wrong to tell others, unless there is a serious reason. If we find out that someone is having a bad time in a relationship then we might try and help the couple directly, but it is not your story to share. It is a personal story.

We might find out that someone had been in trouble with the police when they were young....but we have no right to spread that news around, because that would ruin the person's reputation today. And, of course, it is even more wrong to say things about a person which are not true.

JPC is a community where people are accepted and valued. No-one should feel uncomfortable or afraid to join in. No-one should feel excluded or offended because they are worried about gossip.

Let us pray that we all do our part to keep communication open and honest. Let's try and turn the negatives of new technology.....into positives. Let's use it to our advantage and keep the friendly conversations going online and face to face.

I look forward to seeing you at the Deaf Catholic Conference in August. I know we will have the chance to look at the ways our community has changed over the years....and more importantly...we can discuss ways that we can nurture our community and keep it a happy, friendly and safe place for everyone.

Spiritual Support and Planning Sacraments:

Our Chaplain is able to support the practice of your faith and your faith development—using Auslan.

Our Chaplain can also organise any sacraments, such as Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Weddings and Funerals.

Community activities—IMPORTANT FOR SOCIAL INTERACTION AND LEARNING SOMETHING NEW:

We encourage our community members to be an active part of the Deaf community and get out and about to meet new and old friends. This is a way to explore new areas and learn new skills in a comfortable environment.

We have our seniors group called "Pankina", a Deaf Men's Group, a Signee Tots Playgroup, a Ladies and a Deaf Art Group. And all activities are open to any Deaf and hard of hearing people and their families.

This is a very enjoyable and rewarding part of the pastoral program for us!

RECIPES...

CHOCOLATE AND RASPBERRY SELF – SAUCING PUDDING

Ingredients:

- 1 x 260g pct. chocolate sponge pudding mix
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons water
- 200g frozen raspberries
- 375ml (1 1/2 cups) boiling water
- Icing sugar, to dust
- Vanilla ice-cream, to serve

Method—Step 1:

Preheat oven to 180°C. Place the pudding mix in a large bowl. Add the egg and water. Use an electric beater to beat on low speed until just combined. Increase speed to medium and beat for a further minute or until the mixture thickens slightly.

Step 2

Use a spoon to fold in raspberries until just combined. Spoon egg mixture into a 1.5L (6-cup) capacity ovenproof dish. Sprinkle sauce mix from the pudding mix packet evenly over the egg mixture.

Step 3

Carefully pour the boiling water over the egg mixture. Bake in oven for 35-40 minutes or until a cake-like top forms and the centre springs back when lightly tapped. Dust with icing sugar and serve immediately with

ice-cream.

GOLDEN SYRUP DUMPLINGS

Ingredients:

- 150g (1 cup) self-raising flour
- 60g unsalted butter, cubed
- 1 egg
- 1-2 tablespoons milk, to beat
- Thick cream, to serve
- Syrup
- 30g butter
- 220g (1 cup) caster sugar
- 4 tablespoons golden syrup
- 1 small lemon, juiced

<u>Method—Step 1:</u> Sift flour into a bowl, then rub in butter until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Beat egg with a little milk and pour into flour mixture. Combine to form a dough, then divide into small balls.

Step 2

To make the syrup, combine the ingredients together with 1 cup of water in a pan and bring to the boil over medium heat. Carefully add dough balls to syrup and boil for 20 minutes. Serve with syrup and
